**Index to Harry J. Podmore’s
“Jews in Trenton History”**

Harry J. Podmore (1891-1962) spent most of his career writing about the history of Trenton. Included in his work was “Jews in Trenton History,” a 45-part series written from 1925 to 1930 in *The Community Messenger*, a publication of the Young Men’s Hebrew Association’s Community Home. In these articles, Podmore uses information found in newspapers, published histories of Trenton and memories of citizens to tell the story of the Jews of Trenton from their first arrival in the 1850s up until the 1920s. This includes histories of synagogues, clubs and associations that were the center of their social and cultural lives. He also provides information about individuals, sometimes writing robust histories of the more prominent families (as highlighted in the table of contents), giving information about where individuals immigrated from and what they did for a living, or simply listing what organizations they were associated with. Finally, he does give a glimpse into the Jewish neighborhoods of that time by providing information about where specific businesses, theatres, churches, and synagogues were located.
